

Inhaler Pouch – Zipped Instructions

To make 1 bag you need :

- 2 X Outer Fabric 10" x 7"
- 2 X Lining Fabric 10" x 7"
- 1 X 10" zip
- 1 X Label



Lay the zip on the first piece of the outer fabric, right sides together, so the fabric is right side up and the zip is right side down.

Line up the edge of the zip to the raw edge of the fabric and clip or pin.

Add the first piece of the lining fabric face down over the zip, again line up the edges.

Using your zipper foot sew the sandwich together with $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. As you get to the zipper pull, raise your machine foot & move the zipper pull out of the way. Your zip is now sandwiched between the outer & lining.

Repeat for the other side of the zip. Outer fabric right side up, zip right side down, lining fabric right side down with the edges aligned (zip is sandwiched between outer & lining). Again, raise your machine foot when you get to the zipper pull & move it out of the way.

Sew your sandwich together.

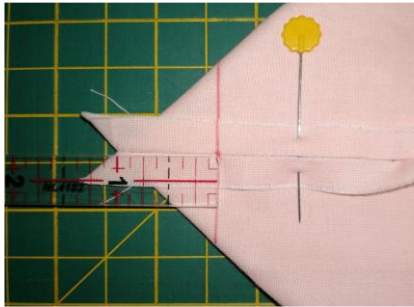
Press all seams away from the zip & top stitch along both sides.

Open the zip so it can be turned once the seams are sewn.

Put the outer fabrics together and the lining fabrics together (right sides facing). Pin or clip all the way around. Insert the folded CforC label inside the seam of the outer fabric, lining up the raw edges of the label with the raw edges of the fabric. Then sew around all sides with a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance leaving a 4" gap for turning on the bottom of the lining fabric



Trim the excess from the seams at the zip to reduce the bulk (but don't use your best fabric scissors!)



Box the corners by matching the side & bottom seams, measure 1" from the corner and draw a line across. Sew on this line. Repeat on all four corners. Cut the excess off.

Turn through. Press and pin the opening in the bottom edge of the lining. Sew up the gap with a straight stitch as close to the edge as possible. Tuck the lining inside, press if necessary and you're done!
